Review of Last Meeting Highlights

- There is a growing demand for training in artificial intelligence (AI), which is seen as critical to maintaining workforce relevance.
- Limited access to reliable internet in rural areas continues to hinder participation in education and training programs.
- Despite having high-demand, high-wage programs like Health Information Technology listed on the ETPL and Master Credential List, enrollment remains low
- Employers consistently report a lack of essential soft skills, ie. emotional intelligence, communication, teamwork, and adaptability, among job seekers.

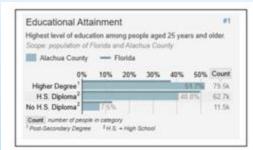

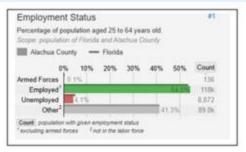

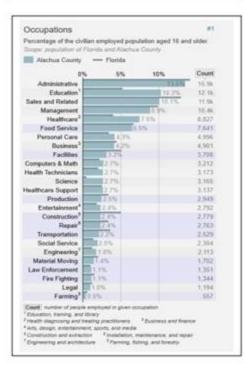
Educational Attainment, Unemployment and Top 5 Industries w/ Median pay by County
