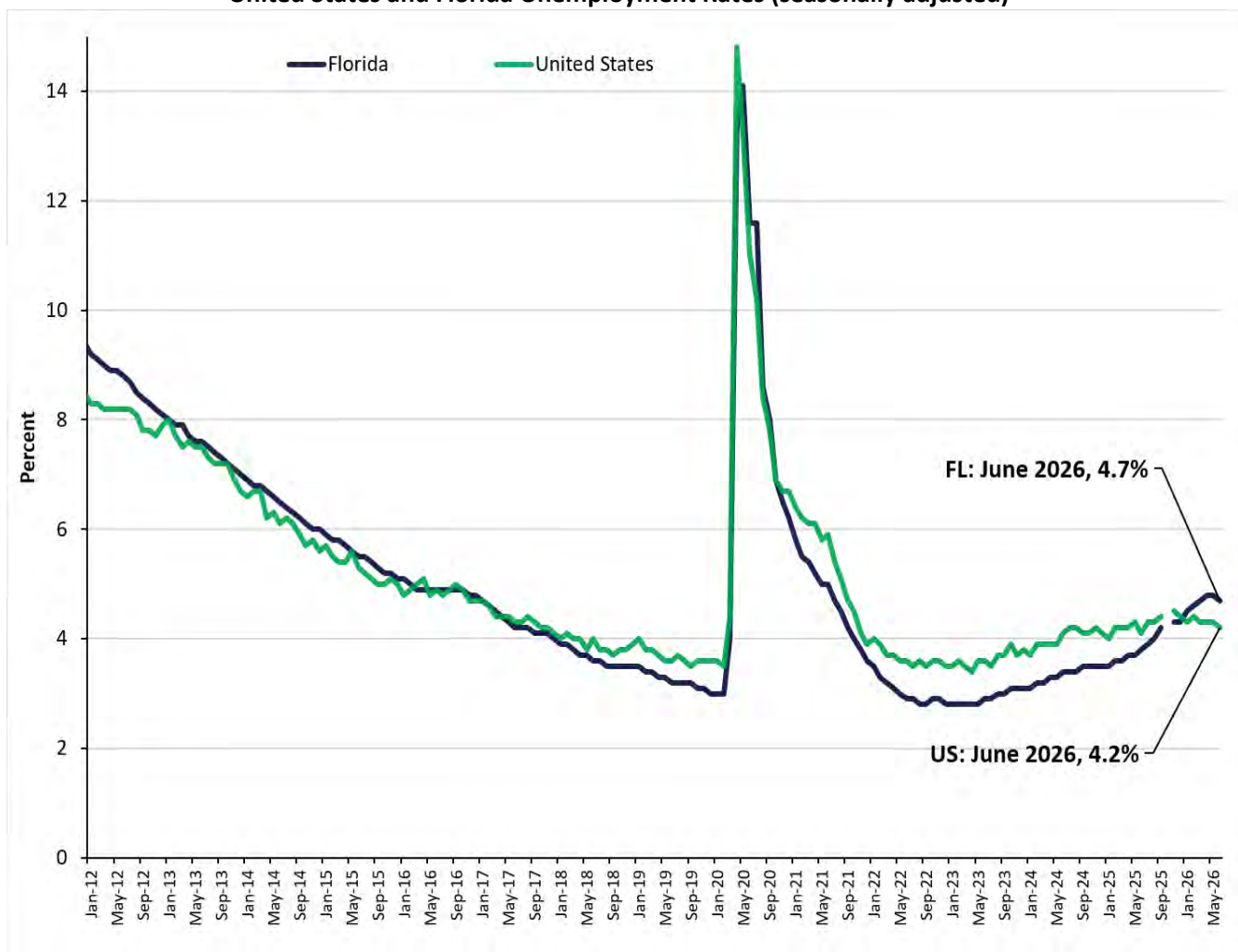
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Florida's June Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.7 percent in June 2026, down from 4.8 percent in May 2026, and up 0.9 percentage point from a year ago. There were 525,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,139,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in June.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,033,300 in June 2026, an increase of 11,100 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 30,700 jobs over the year, an increase of 0.3 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 0.3 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Five of ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in June.
- The industry gaining jobs over the year were education and health services (+39,000 jobs, +2.5 percent), professional and business services (+13,400 jobs, +0.8 percent), leisure and hospitality (+8,700 jobs, +0.7 percent), trade, transportation, and utilities (+600 jobs, less than +0.1 percent), and manufacturing (+400 jobs, +0.1 percent).
- The industries losing jobs over the year included financial activities (-12,900 jobs, -1.9 percent); total government (-10,500 jobs, -0.9 percent); information (-3,300 jobs, -2.2 percent); construction (-3,200 jobs, -0.5 percent); and other services (-1,600 jobs, -0.4 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2026, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.0 percent), followed by Monroe County (3.2 percent), and Wakulla County (4.1 percent).
- Taylor County had the highest unemployment rate (8.3 percent) in Florida in June 2026, followed by Sumter County (7.8 percent), and Hamilton County (6.8 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2026, 19 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+20,600 jobs, +1.4 percent), followed by the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+8,800 jobs, +0.7 percent), the North Port-Bradenton-Sarasota MSA (+4,000 jobs, +1.1 percent), and the Lakeland-Winter Haven MSA (+3,800 jobs, +1.4 percent).
- Four metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in June 2026. The only area losing more than 1,000 jobs was the Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Sunrise MD (-5,000 jobs, -0.5 percent).
- The Homosassa Springs MSA and the Palm Bay-Melbourne-Titusville MSA were unchanged in jobs over the year.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.

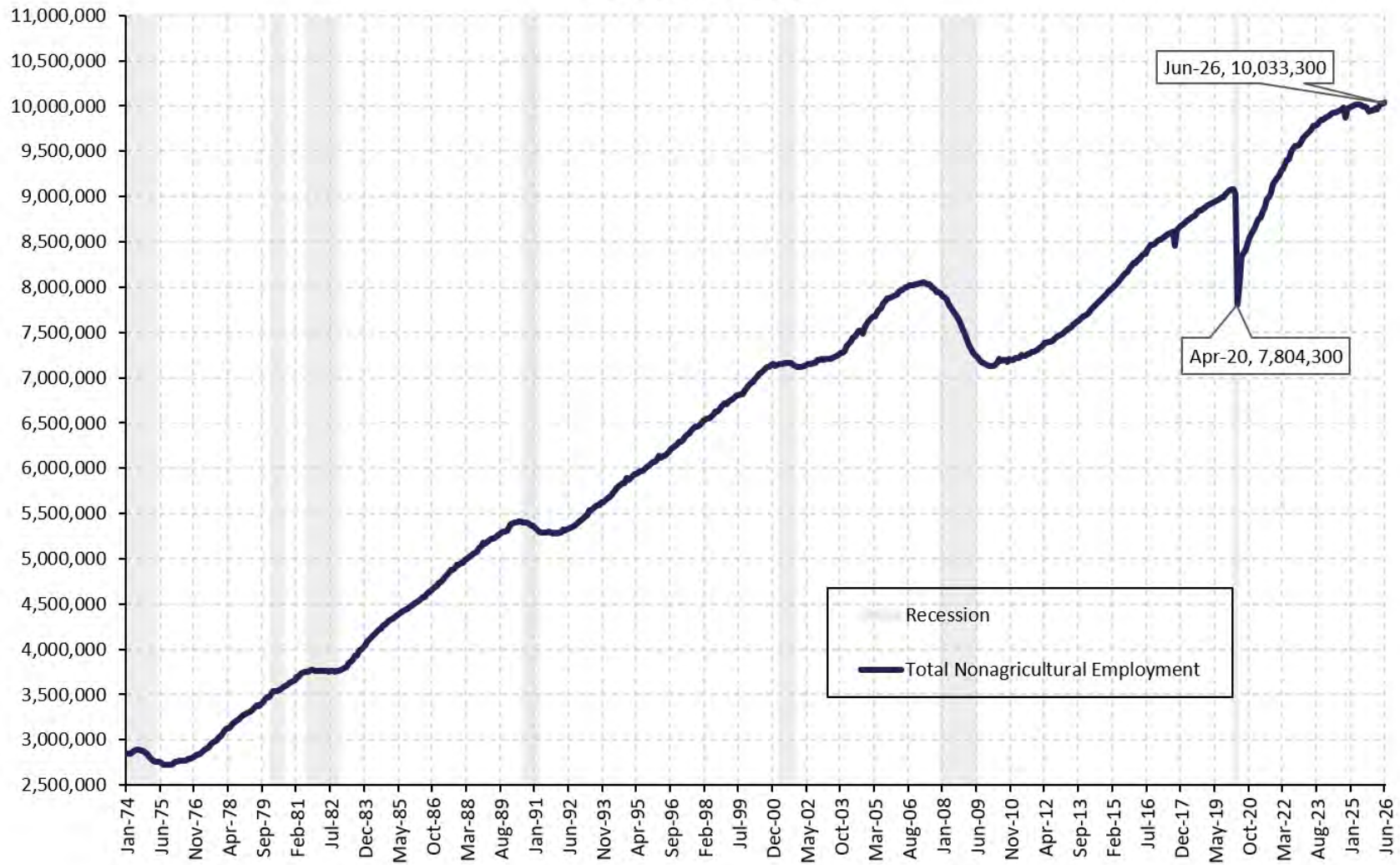

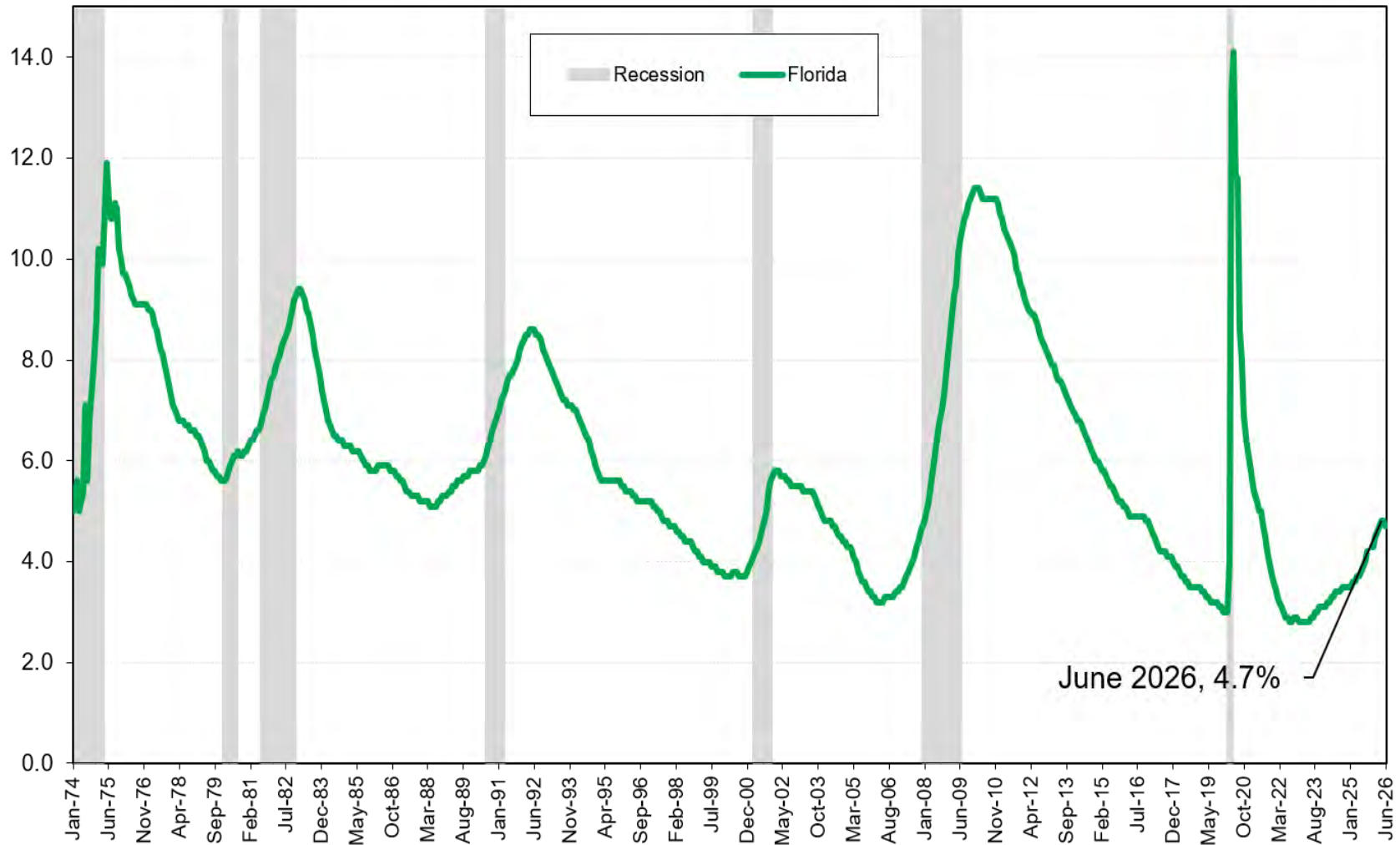

January 1974 - June 2026



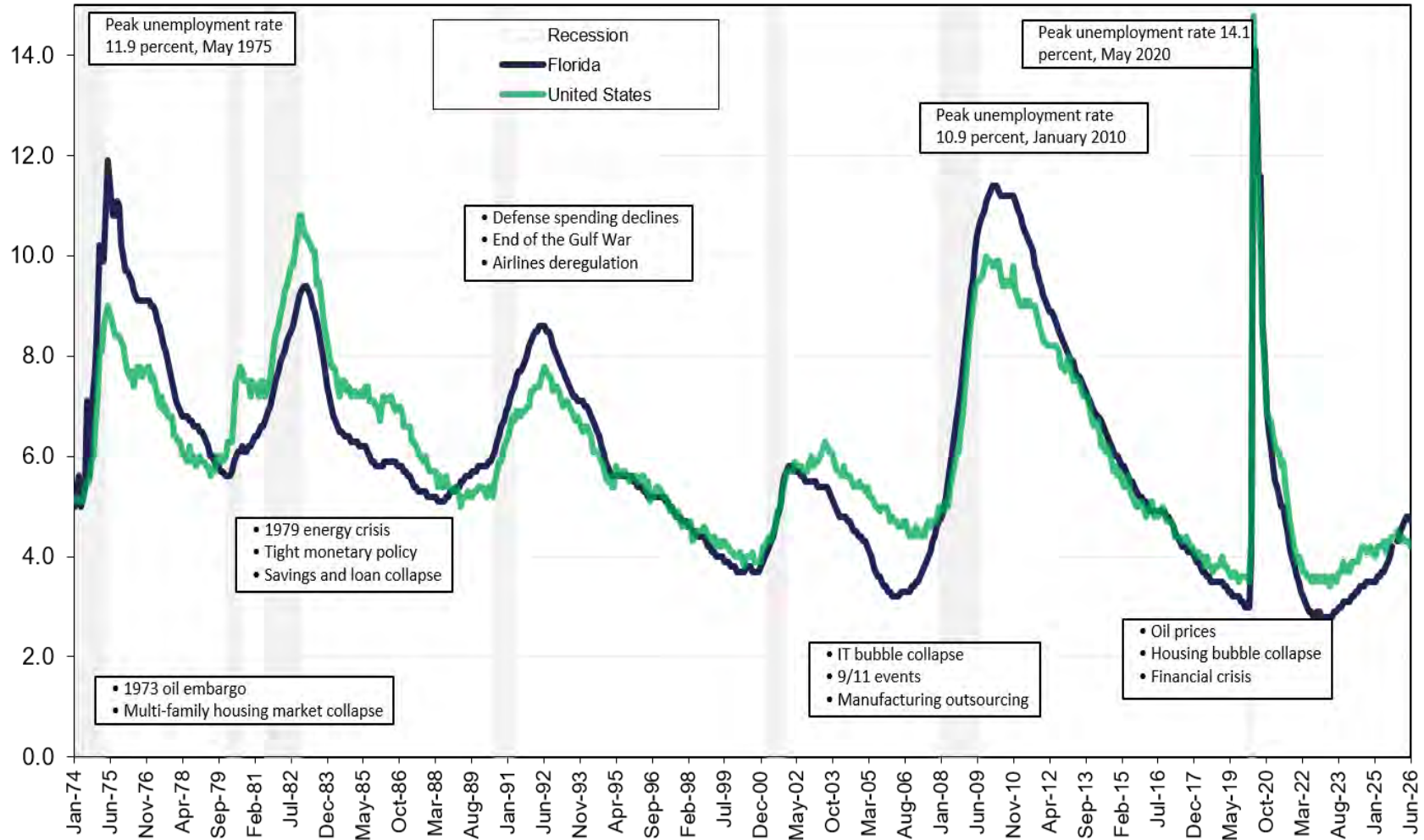

January 1974 - June 2026



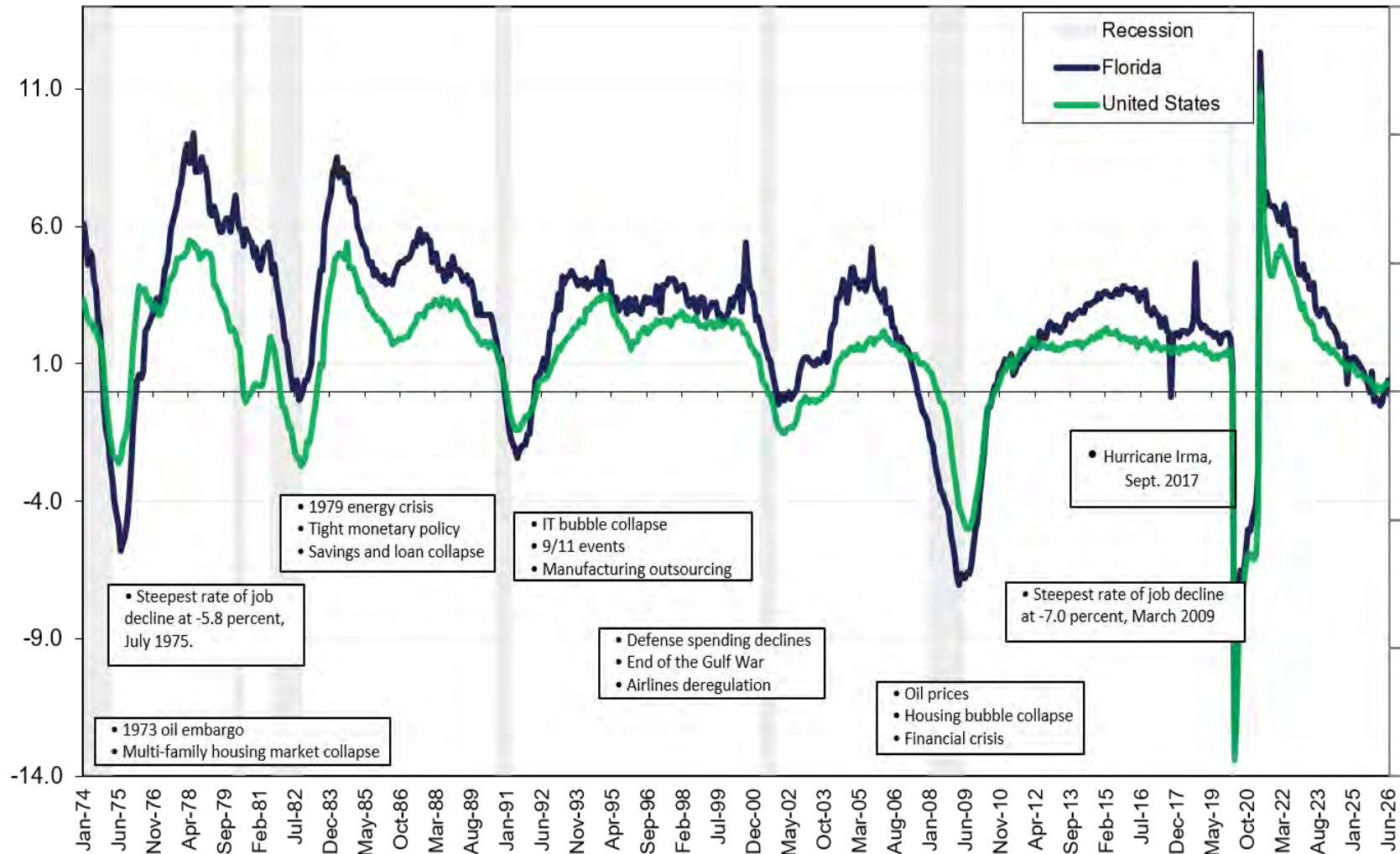
