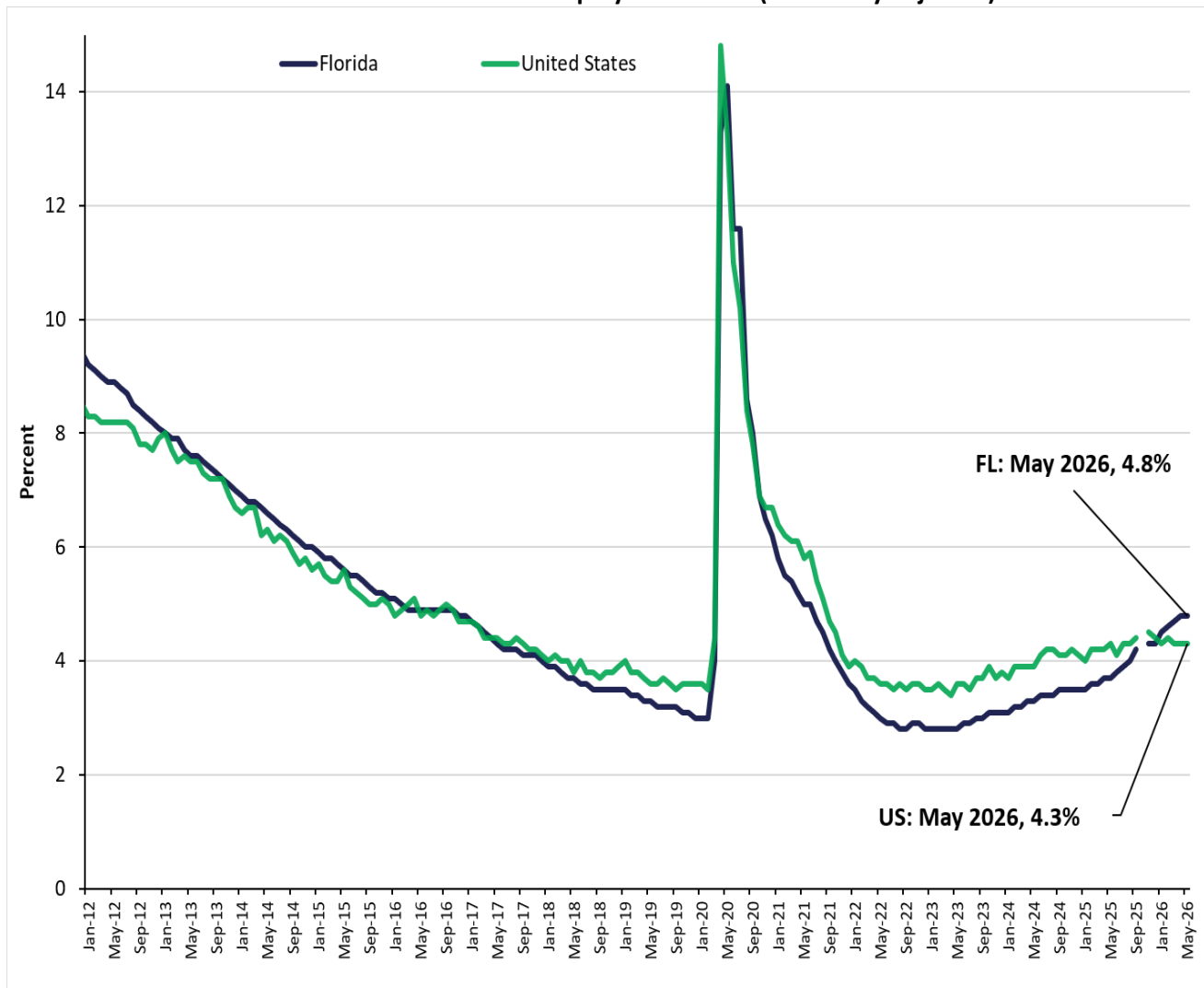
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Florida's May Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8 percent in May 2026, unchanged from the April 2026 rate, and up 1.1 percentage points from a year ago. There were 531,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,145,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,024,300 in May 2026, a decrease of 2,000 jobs (less than -0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 11,000 jobs over the year, an increase of 0.1 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 0.3 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Seven of ten major industries experienced negative over-the-year job growth in May.
- The industry gaining jobs over the year were education and health services (+31,400 jobs, +2.0 percent), professional and business services (+17,600 jobs, +1.1 percent), and leisure and hospitality (+5,300 jobs, +0.4 percent).
- The industries losing jobs over the year included financial activities (-15,500 jobs, -2.2 percent); total government (-9,200 jobs, -0.8 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (-6,900 jobs, -0.3 percent); other services (-4,500 jobs, -1.2 percent); information (-4,000 jobs, -2.6 percent); construction (-2,900 jobs, -0.4 percent); and manufacturing (-500 jobs, -0.1 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2026, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.6 percent), followed by Monroe County (3.0 percent), and Wakulla County and Seminole County (4.1 percent each).
- Taylor County had the highest unemployment rate (8.1 percent) in Florida in May 2026, followed by Sumter County (7.6 percent), and Hamilton County (6.9 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2026, 13 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+18,300 jobs, +1.2 percent), followed by the Lakeland-Winter Haven MSA (+3,200 jobs, +1.1 percent), the North Port-Bradenton-Sarasota MSA (+2,900 jobs, +0.8 percent), and the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+2,700 jobs, +0.2 percent).
- Eleven metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in May 2026. The areas losing more than 1,000 jobs were the Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Sunrise MD (-8,300 jobs, -0.9 percent), the West Palm Beach-Boca Raton-Delray Beach MD (-3,500 jobs, -0.5 percent), the Jacksonville MSA (-3,000 jobs, -0.4 percent), the Cape Coral-Fort Myers MSA (-1,600 jobs, -0.5 percent), and the Naples-Marco Island MSA (-1,500 jobs, -0.8 percent).
- The Homosassa Springs MSA was unchanged in jobs over the year.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.

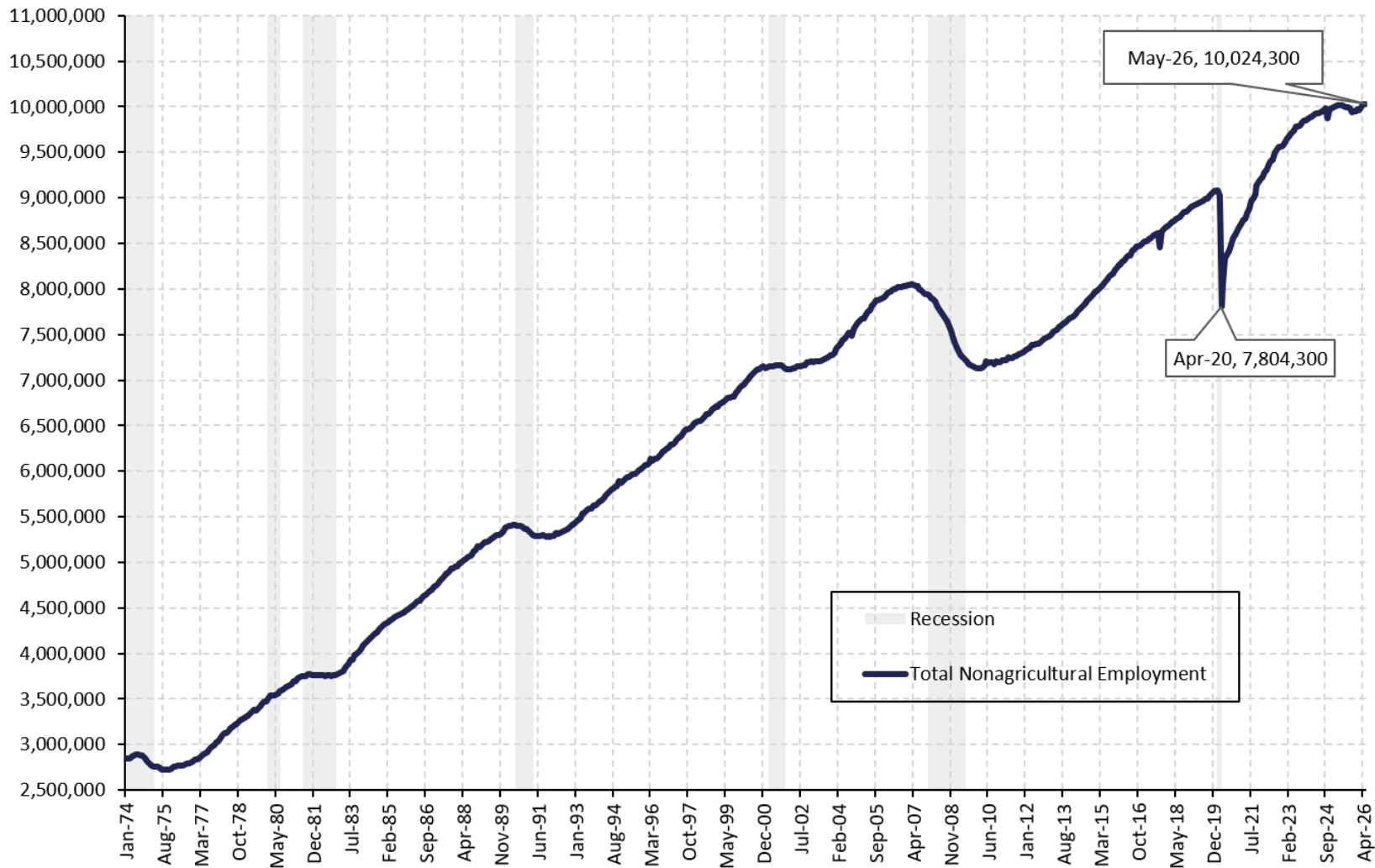

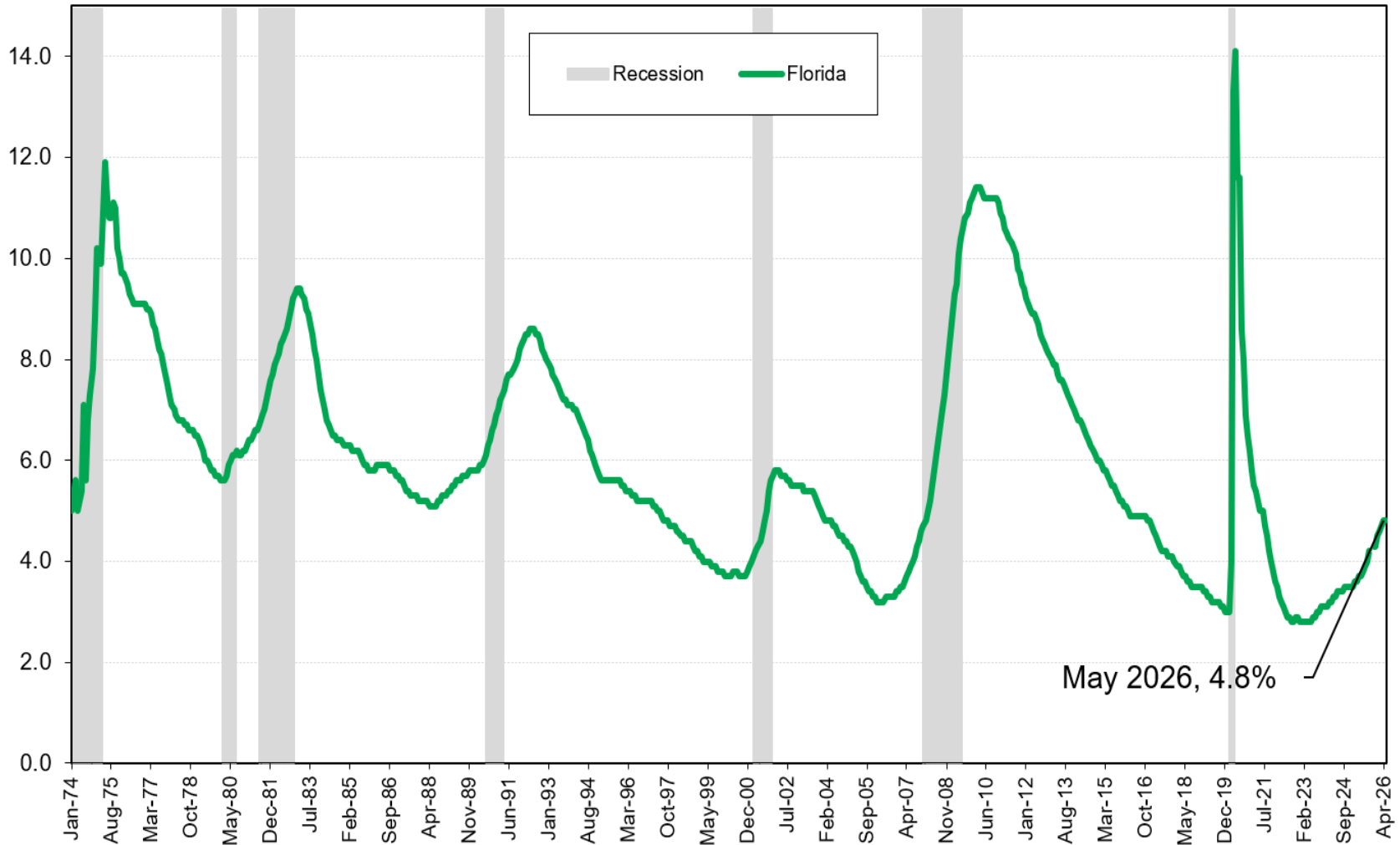

January 1974 - May 2026



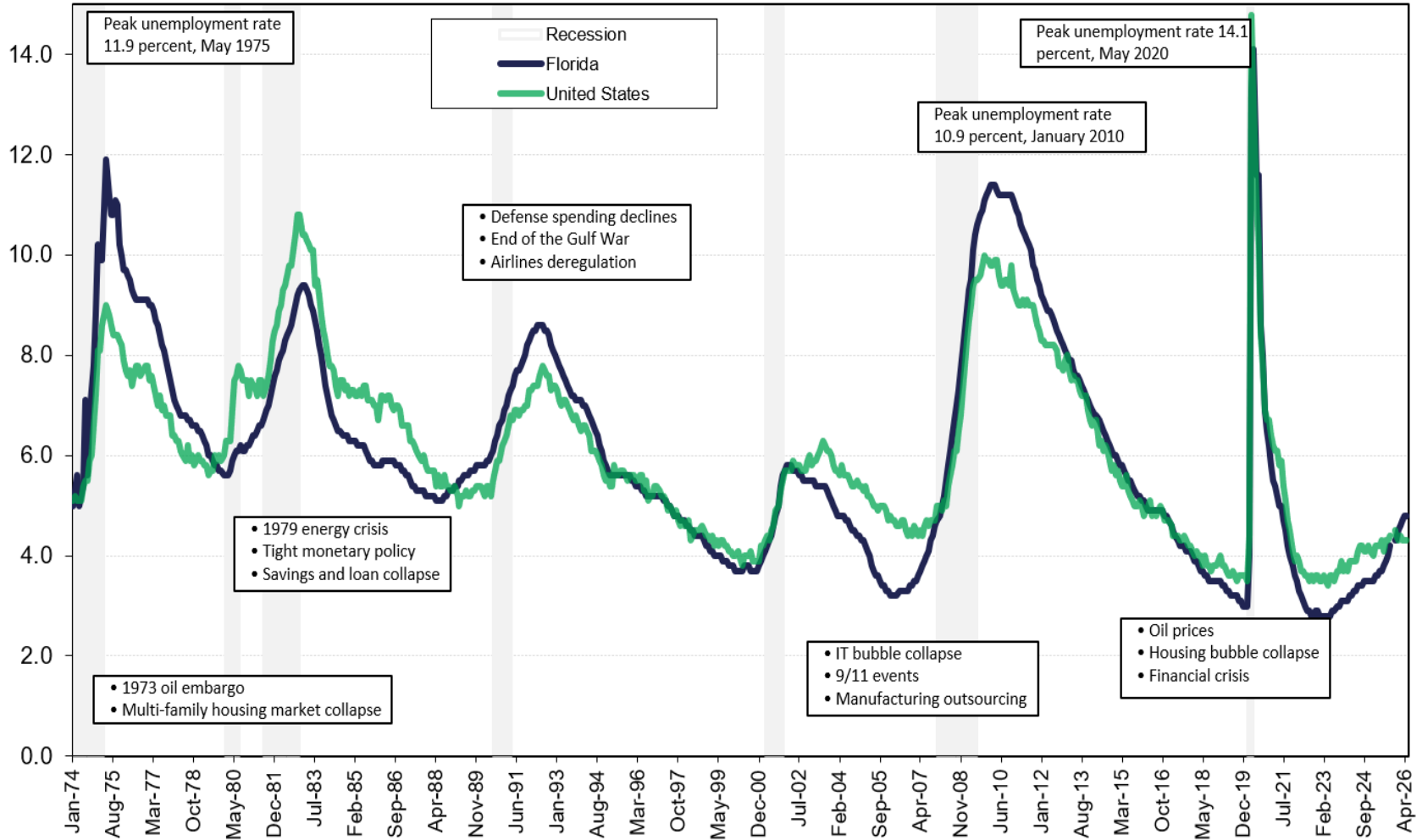

Florida Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods, Seasonally Adjusted January 1974 - May 2026



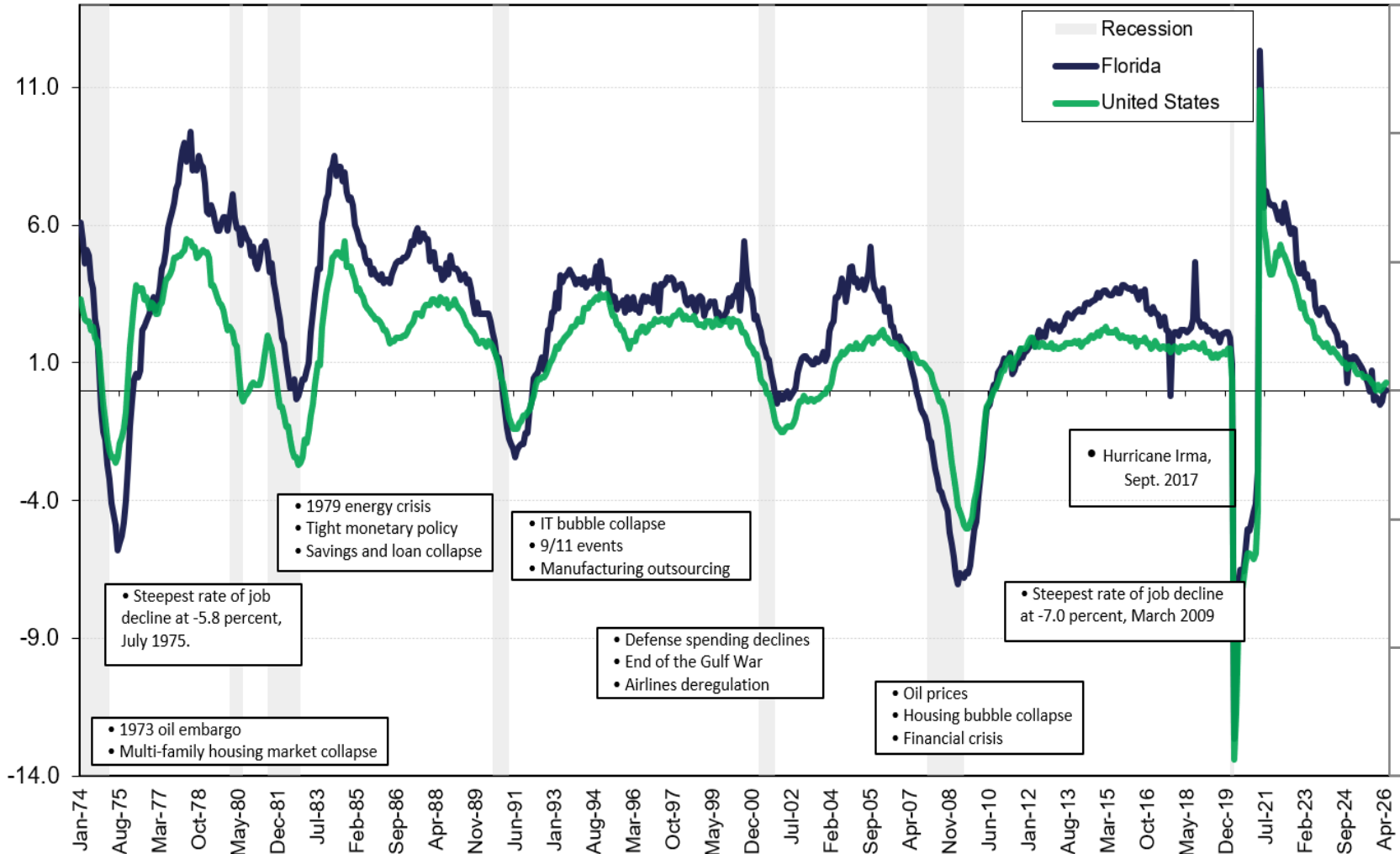

Florida and the United States Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - May 2026



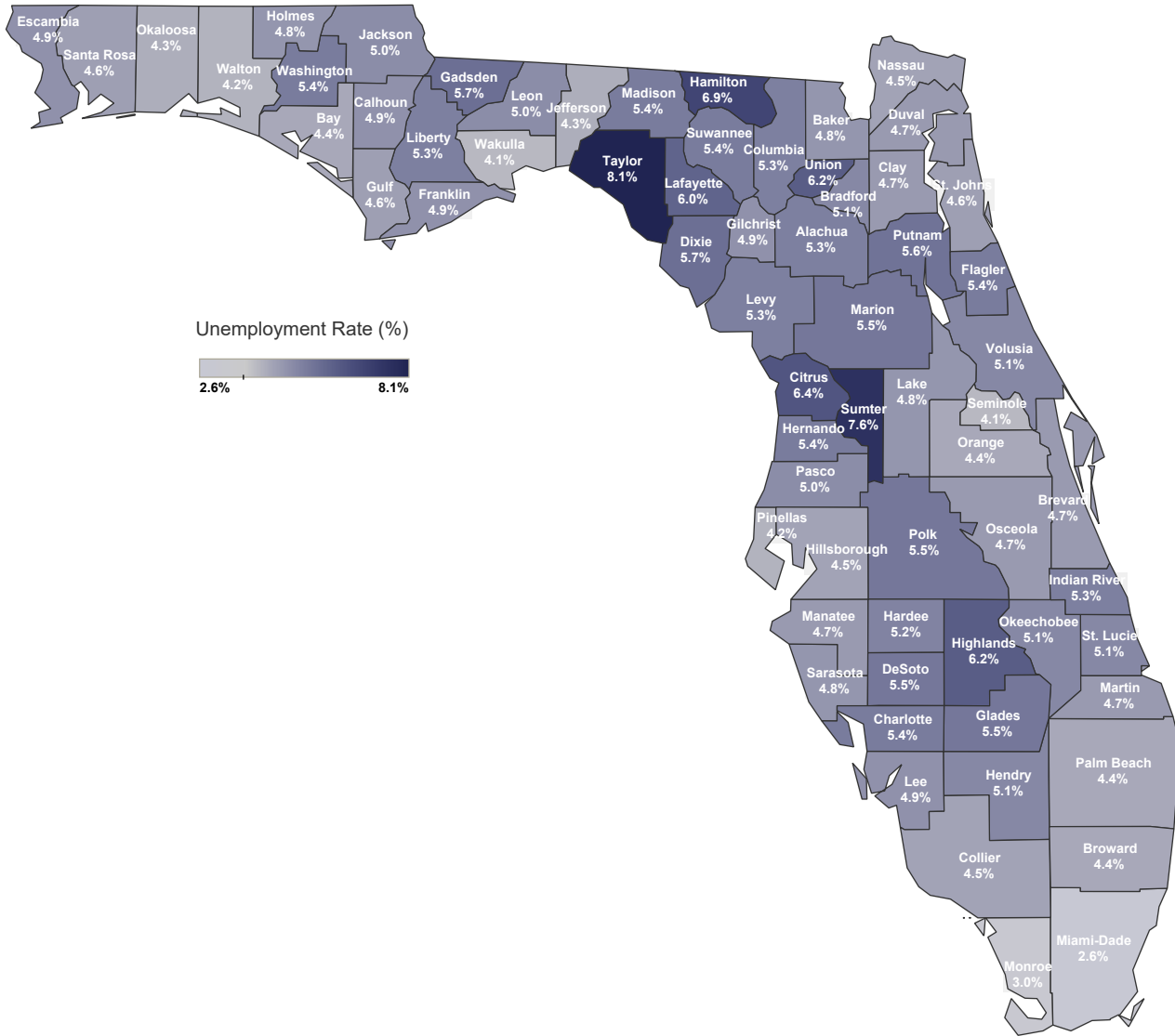
