

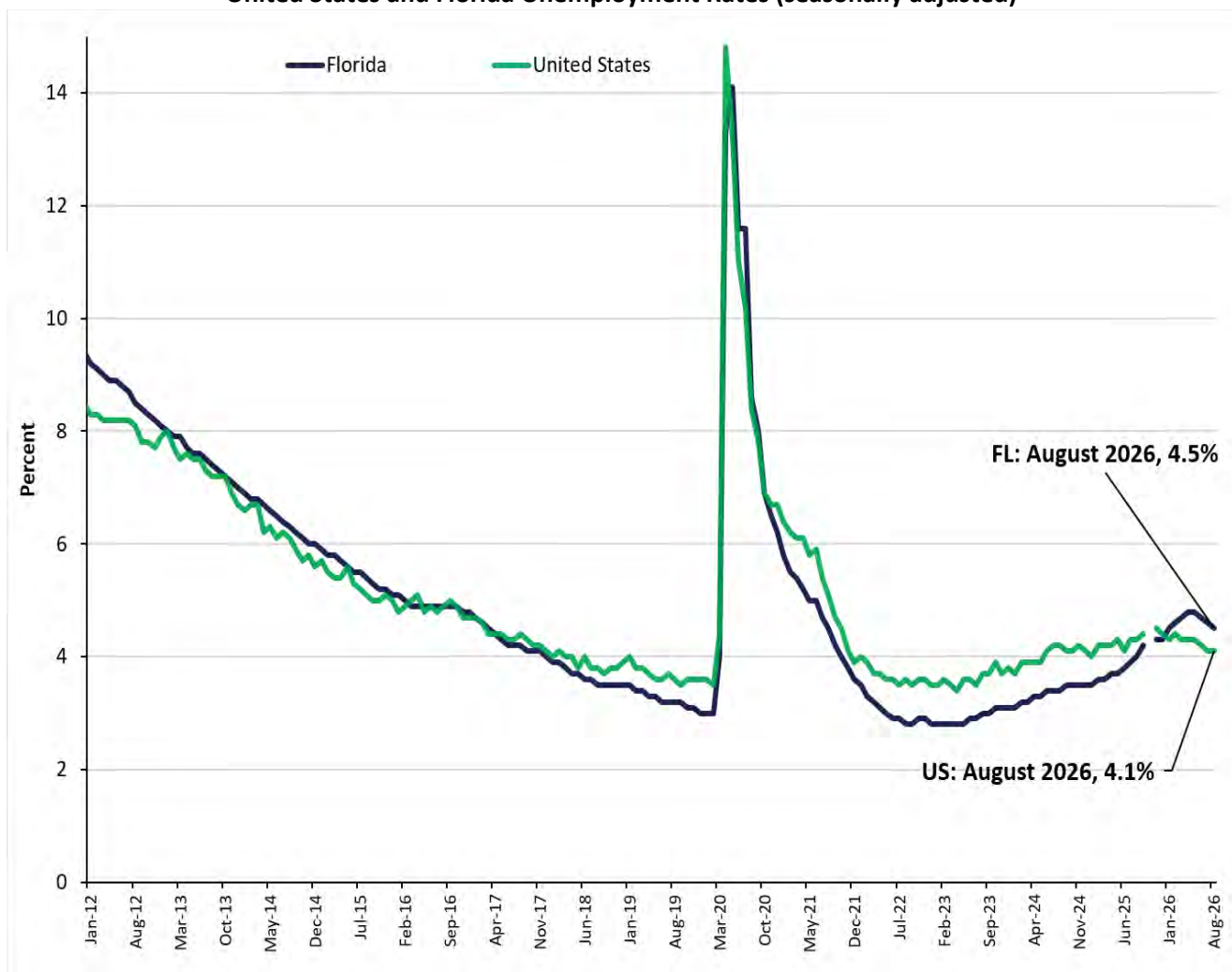
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Florida's August Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.5 percent in August 2026, down 0.1 percentage point from 4.6 percent in July 2026, and up 0.5 percentage point from a year ago. There were 502,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,115,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in August.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,051,600 in August 2026, an increase of 21,800 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 59,000 jobs over the year, an increase of 0.6 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 0.4 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Six of ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in August.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year were education and health services (+39,600 jobs, +2.5 percent), professional and business services (+25,200 jobs, +1.6 percent), leisure and hospitality (+11,600 jobs, +0.9 percent), manufacturing (+2,300 jobs, +0.5 percent), construction (+2,100 jobs, +0.3 percent), and trade, transportation, and utilities (+1,800 jobs, +0.1 percent).
- The industries losing jobs over the year included financial activities (-14,300 jobs, -2.1 percent); total government (-4,900 jobs, -0.4 percent); information (-3,900 jobs, -2.6 percent); and other services (-900 jobs, -0.2 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2026, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.7 percent), followed by Monroe County (3.3 percent), and Wakulla County (4.1 percent).
- Taylor County had the highest unemployment rate (8.2 percent) in Florida in August 2026, followed by Sumter County (7.9 percent), and Highlands County (6.8 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In August 2026, 20 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Tampa MD (+12,500 jobs, +1.2 percent), followed by the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+11,900 jobs, +0.8 percent), the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+6,200 jobs, +0.5 percent), and the West Palm Beach-Boca Raton-Delray Beach MD (+4,800 jobs, +0.7 percent).
- Four metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in August 2026. The areas with the largest losses were the Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Sunrise MD (-600 jobs, -0.1 percent) and the Pensacola-Ferry Pass-Brent MSA (-500 jobs, -0.2 percent).
- The Punta Gorda MSA was unchanged in jobs over the year in August 2026.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.

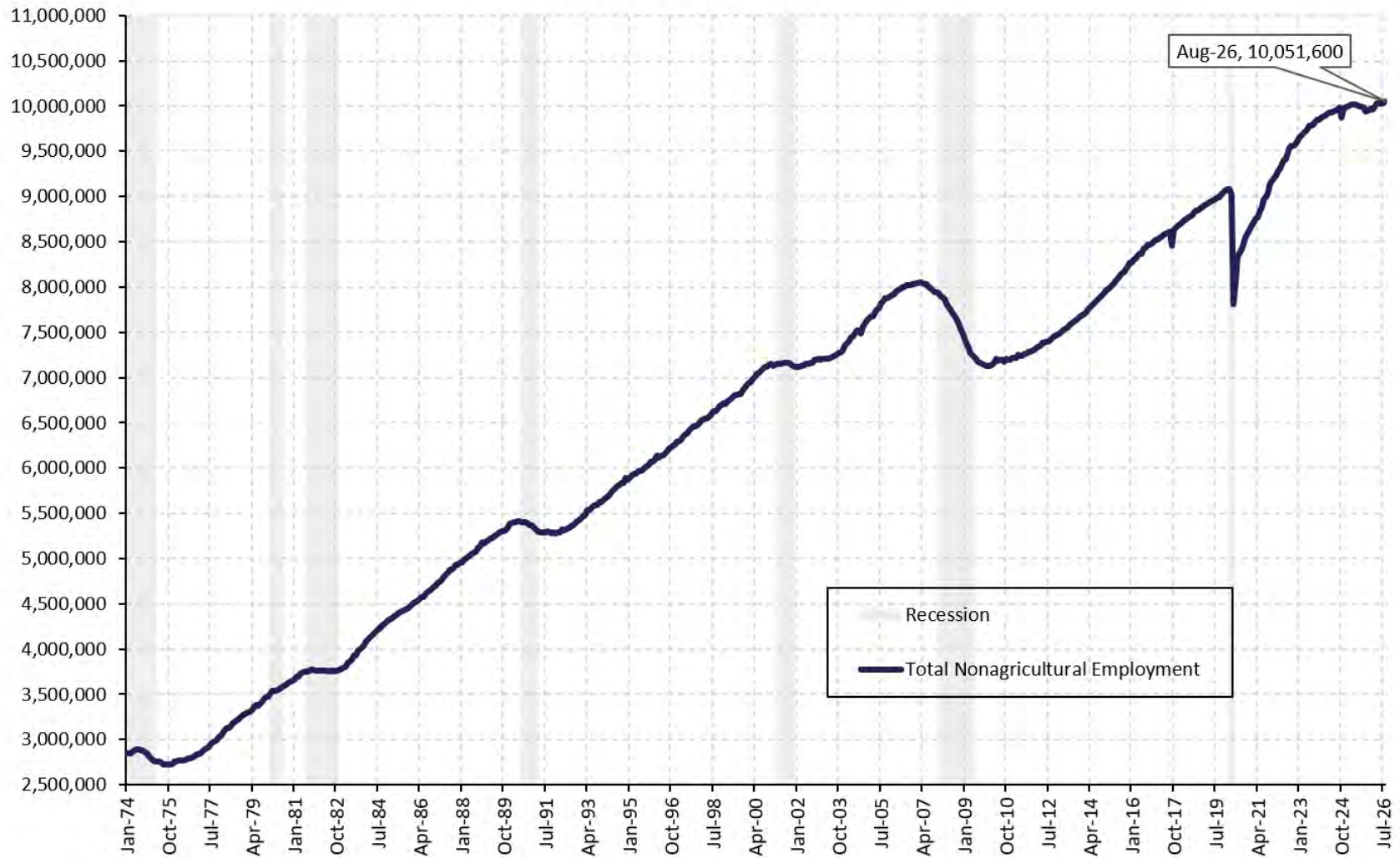

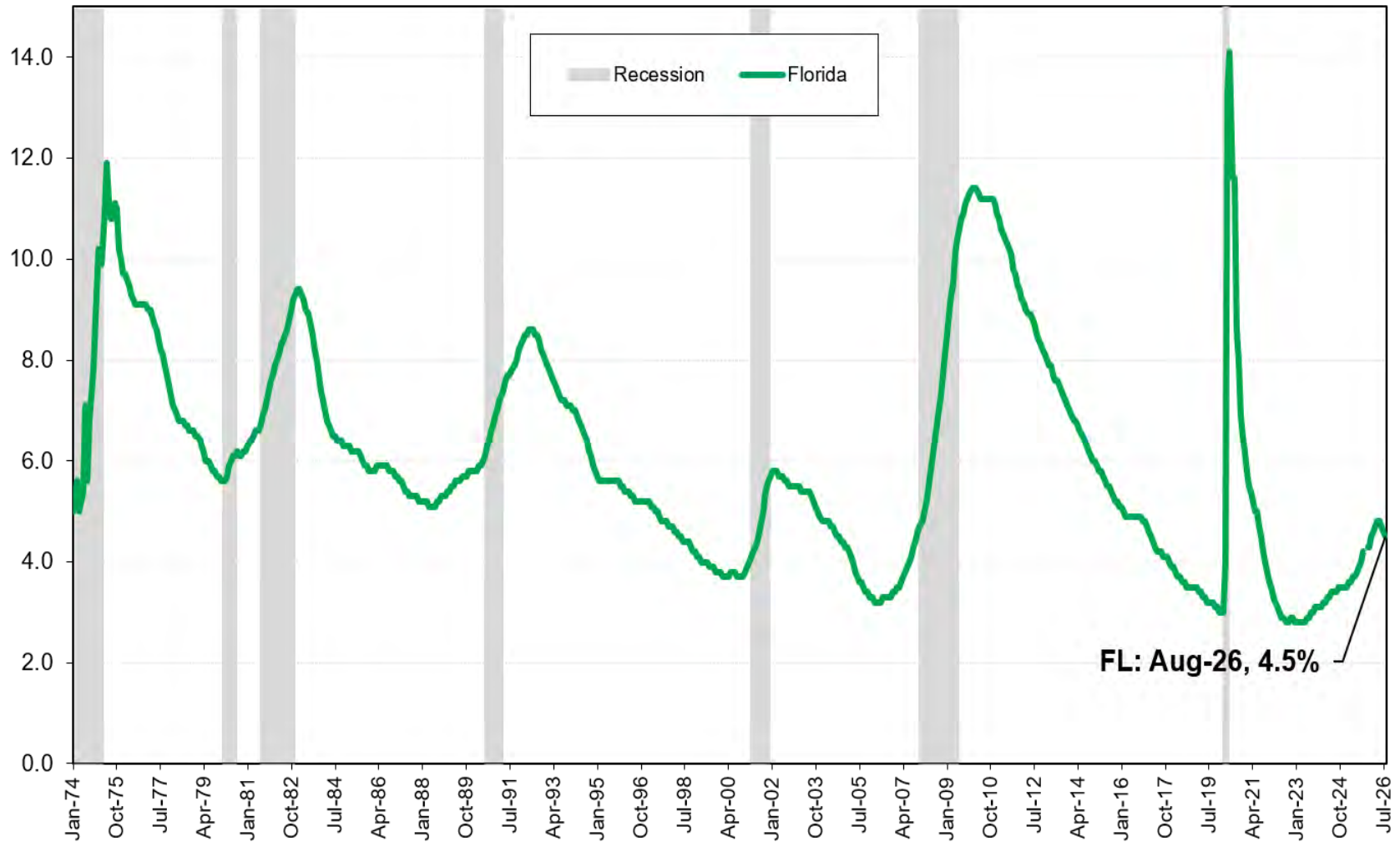

January 1974 - August 2026



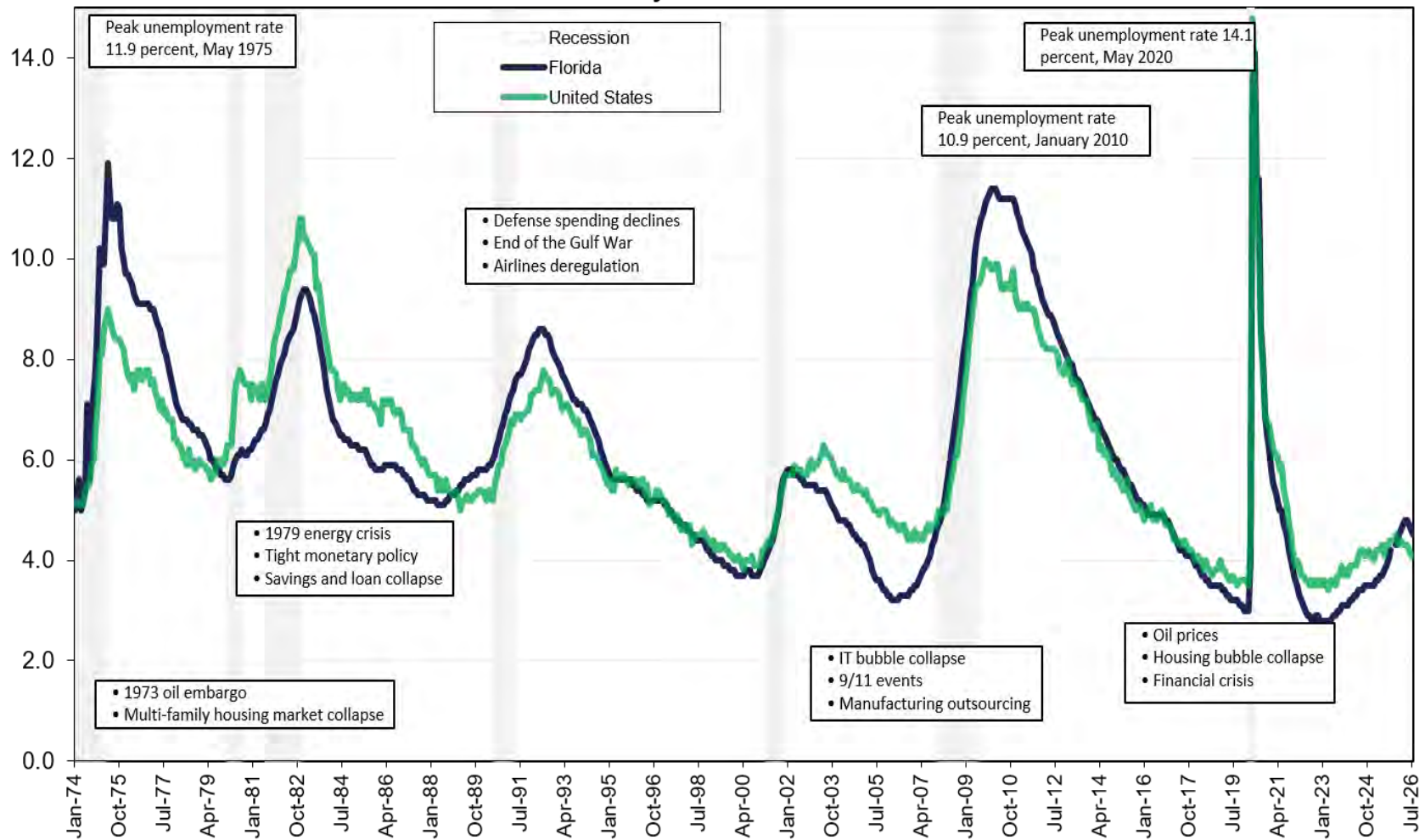

January 1974 - August 2026



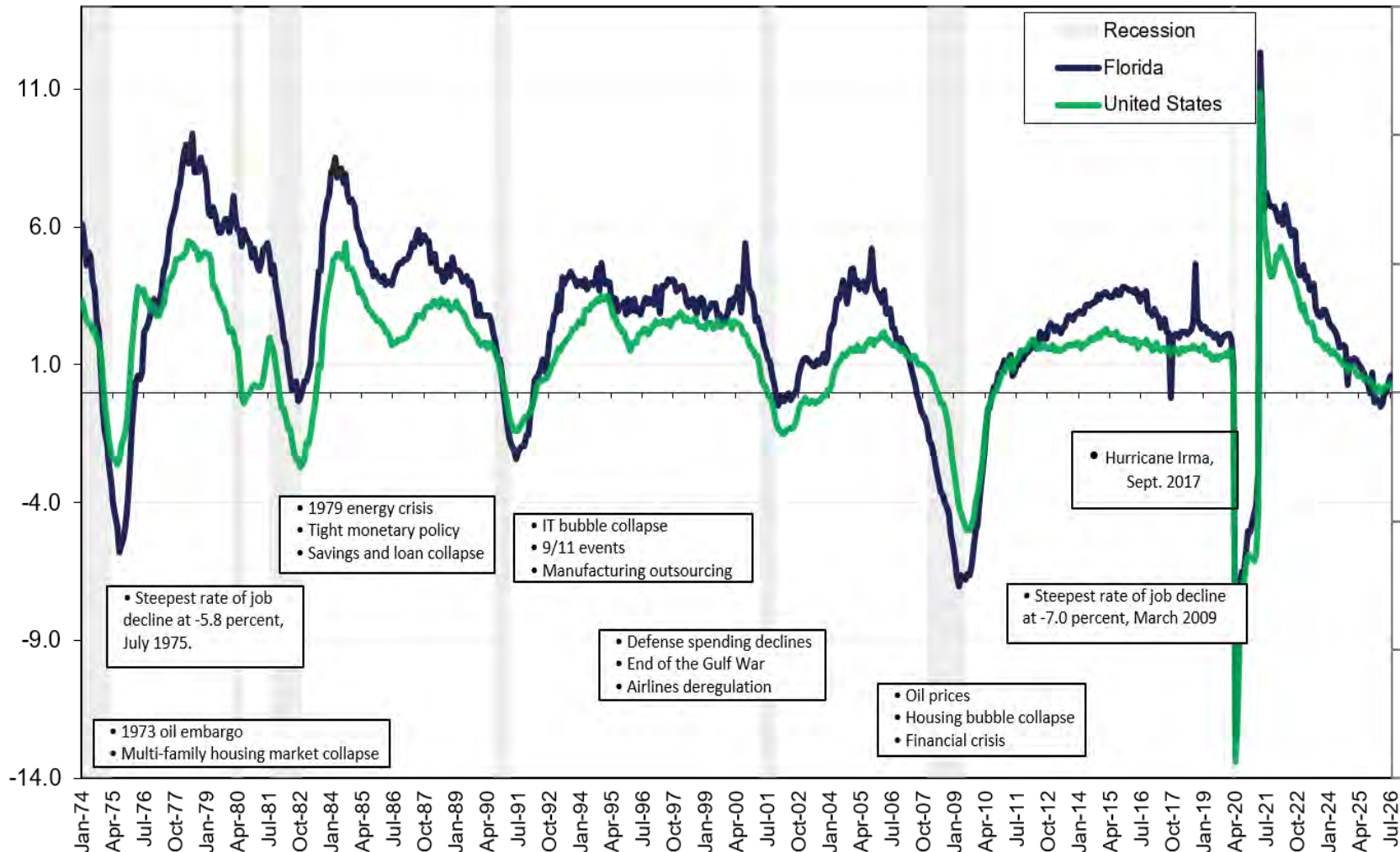

Florida and the United States Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - August 2026



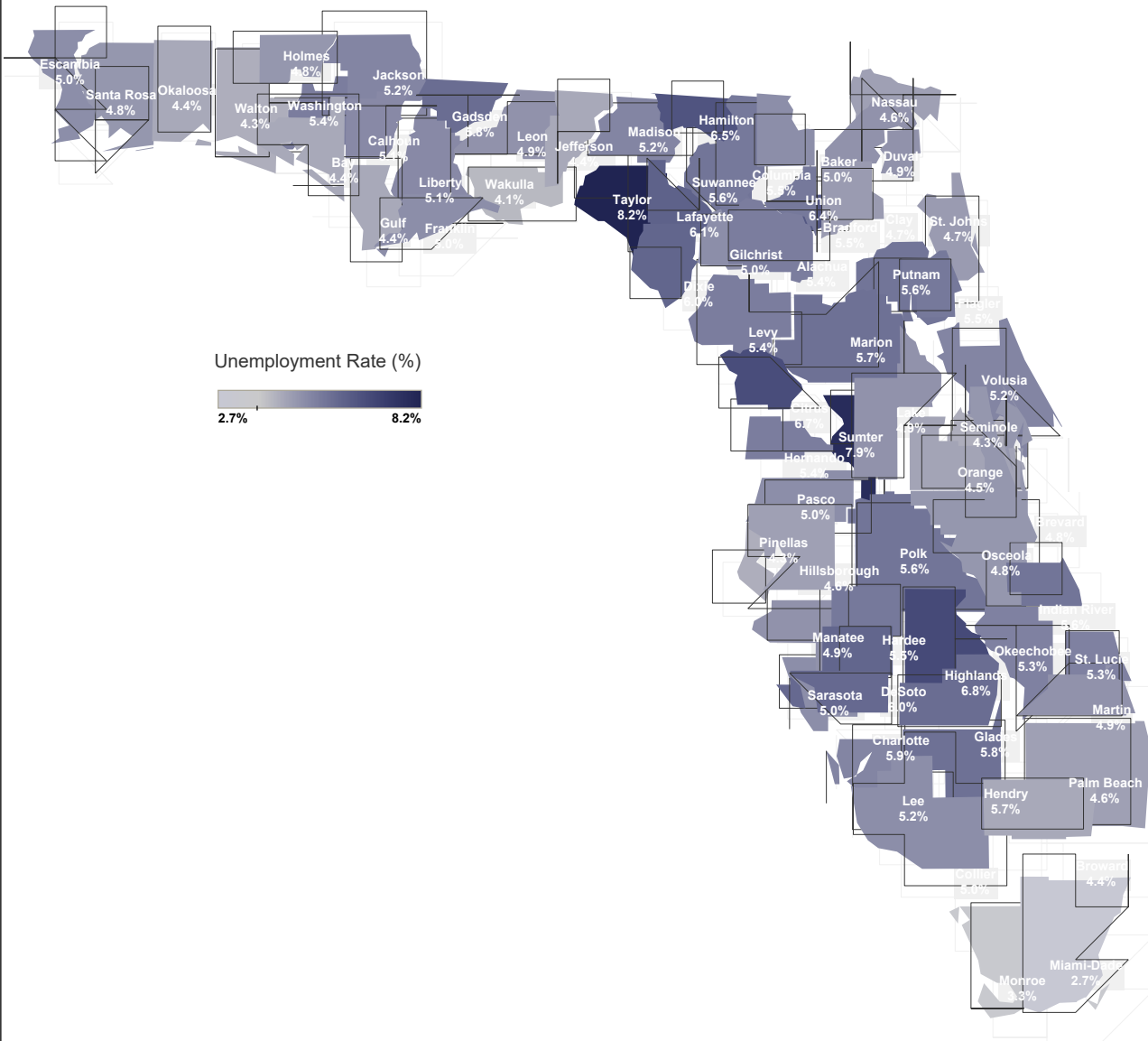
