


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Florida's April Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.7 percent in April 2025, up 0.1 percentage point from the March 2025 rate, and up 0.4 percentage point from a year ago. There were 410,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,203,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in April.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,074,300 in April 2025, an increase of 21,300 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 144,100 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.5 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.2 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in April.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+48,200 jobs, +3.2 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+26,200 jobs, +1.3 percent); total government (+18,400 jobs, +1.6 percent); other services (+12,600 jobs, +3.3 percent); construction (+12,400 jobs, +1.9 percent); professional and business services (+12,200 jobs, +0.8 percent); financial activities (+5,500 jobs, +0.8 percent); leisure and hospitality (+3,100 jobs, +0.2 percent); manufacturing (+3,000 jobs, +0.7 percent); and information (+2,600 jobs, +1.6 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2025, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.4 percent), followed by Miami-Dade County (2.7 percent), and Wakulla County (3.0 percent).
- Sumter County had the highest unemployment rate (6.3 percent) in Florida in April 2025, followed by Taylor County (6.1 percent), and Citrus County and Hamilton County (5.2 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In April 2025, 22 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+28,300 jobs, +1.9 percent), followed by the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+20,900 jobs, +1.6 percent), and the Tampa MD (+14,500 jobs, +1.4 percent).
- Three metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in April 2025. The areas losing jobs were the St. Petersburg-Clearwater-Largo MD (-3,000 jobs, -0.6 percent), followed by the Naples-Marco Island MSA (-2,600 jobs, -1.4 percent), and the Cape Coral-Fort Myers MSA (-200 jobs, -0.1 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.





Florida Total Nonagricultural Employment, Seasonally Adjusted January 1974 - April 2025



Florida Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods, Seasonally Adjusted January 1974 - April 2025




Florida and the United States Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - April 2025


