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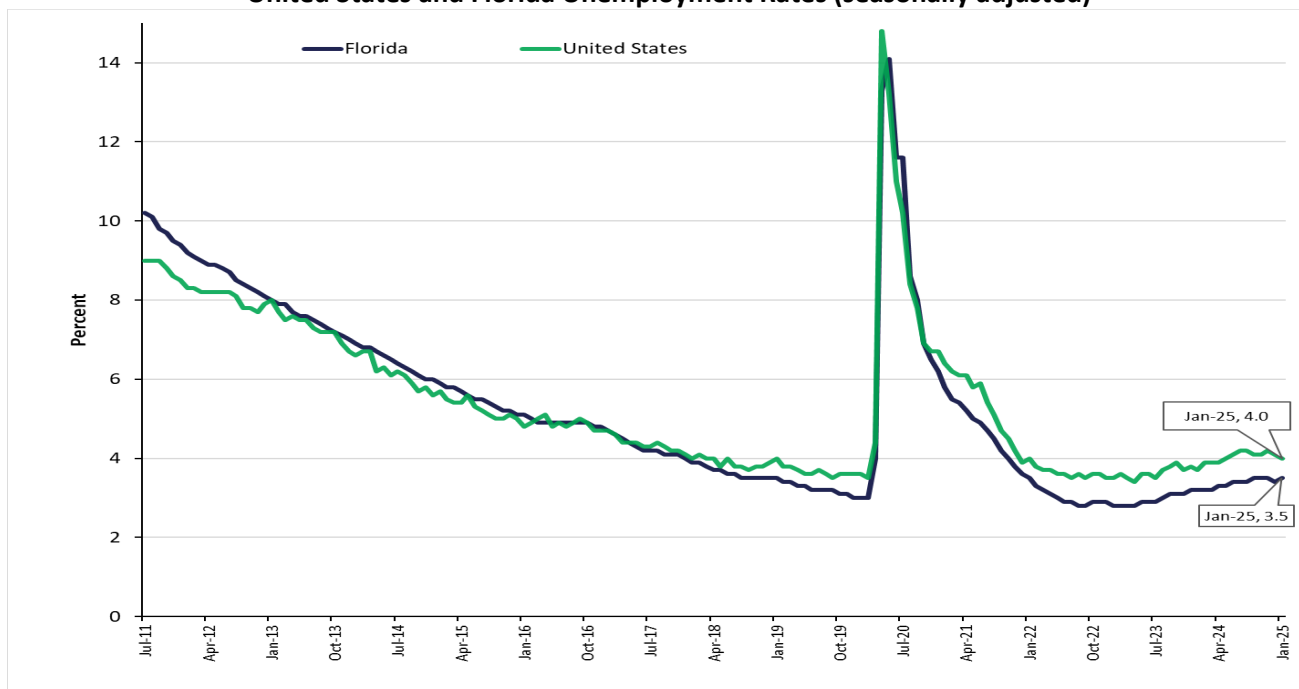
### Florida's January Figures Released

*NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Commerce release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2025 employment data is scheduled for March 17 and March 28, respectively. Also, new and changed metro areas are being introduced with this release (see page 3 for a list of the changes).*

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.5 percent in January 2025, up 0.1 percentage point from the December 2024 rate, and up 0.3 percentage point from a year ago. There were 390,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,188,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.0 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,018,600 in January 2025, an increase of 16,500 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 139,000 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.4 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.3 percent over the year.

### **Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)**

- Nine of ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in January.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+47,800 jobs, +3.2 percent); total government (+25,400 jobs, +2.2 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+23,700 jobs, +1.2 percent); leisure and hospitality (+13,500 jobs, +1.0 percent); construction (+10,700 jobs, +1.7 percent); other services (+9,100 jobs, +2.4 percent); financial activities (+4,200 jobs, +0.6 percent); manufacturing (+3,100 jobs, +0.7 percent); and professional and business services (+1,600 jobs, +0.1 percent).
- The industry losing jobs over the year was information (-100 jobs, -0.1 percent).

### **Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In January 2025, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.4 percent), followed by Monroe County (2.7 percent), and Wakulla County at (3.2 percent).
- Sumter County had the highest unemployment rate (6.9 percent) in Florida in January 2025, followed by Taylor County (6.5 percent), and Citrus County (5.8 percent).

### **Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)**

- In January 2025, 22 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+32,100 jobs, +2.2 percent), followed by the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+26,200 jobs, +2.0 percent), and the Tampa MD (+14,900 jobs, +1.4 percent).
- The metro areas losing jobs over the year were the St. Petersburg-Clearwater-Largo MD (-1,500 jobs, -0.3 percent), the Sebastian-Vero Beach MSA (-400 jobs, -0.7 percent), and the Naples-Marco Island MSA (-300 jobs, -0.2 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.

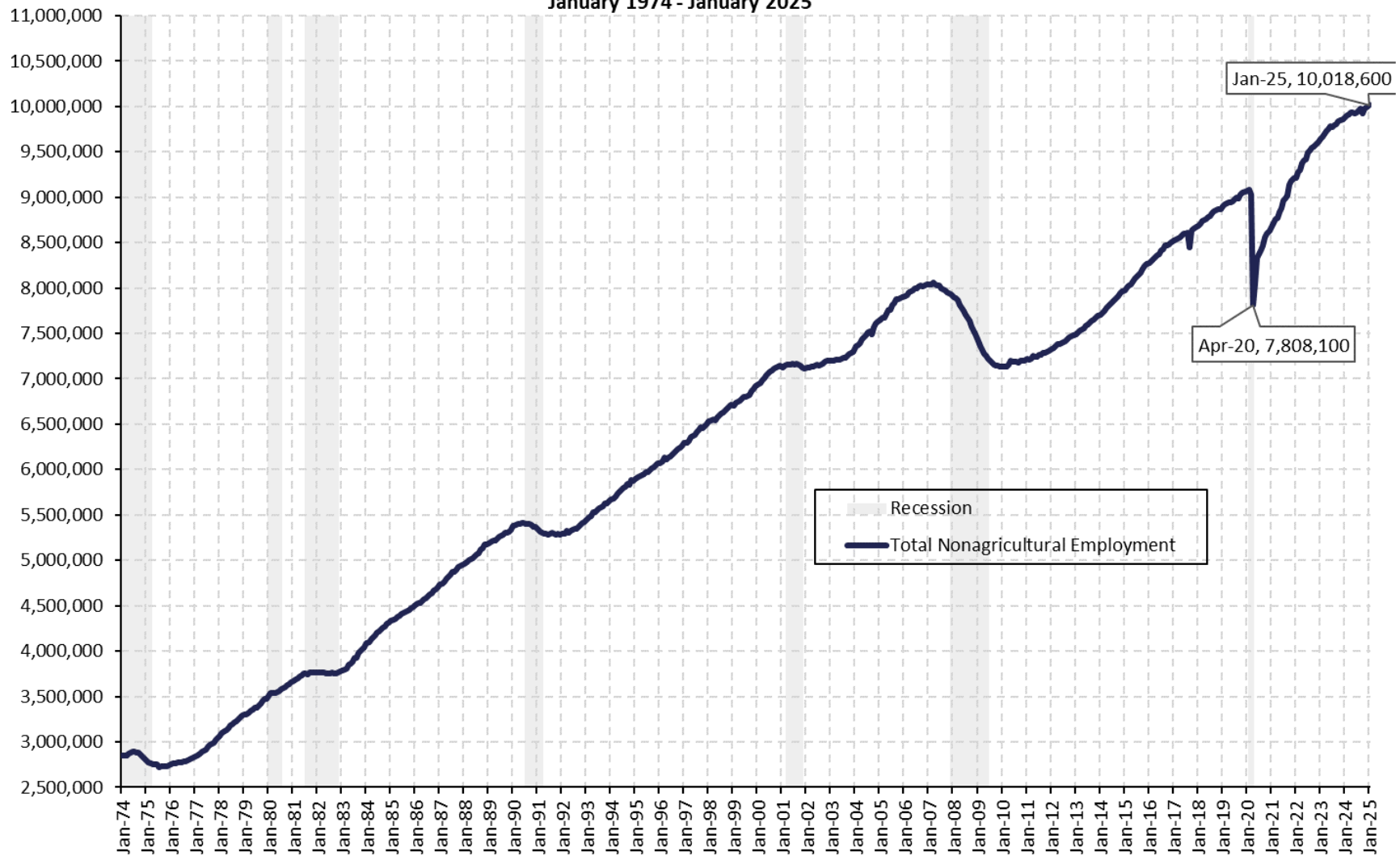

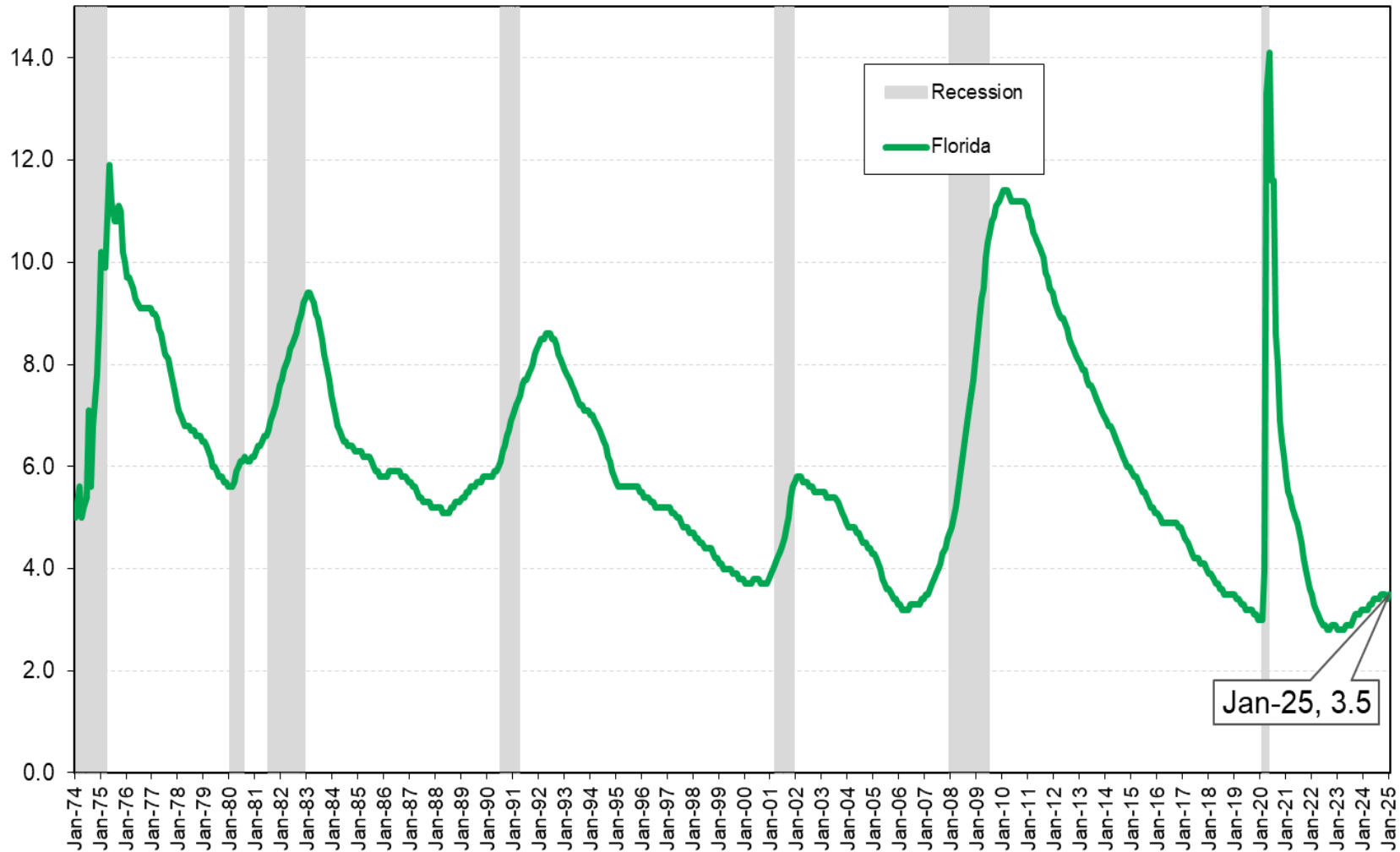

January 1974 - January 2025



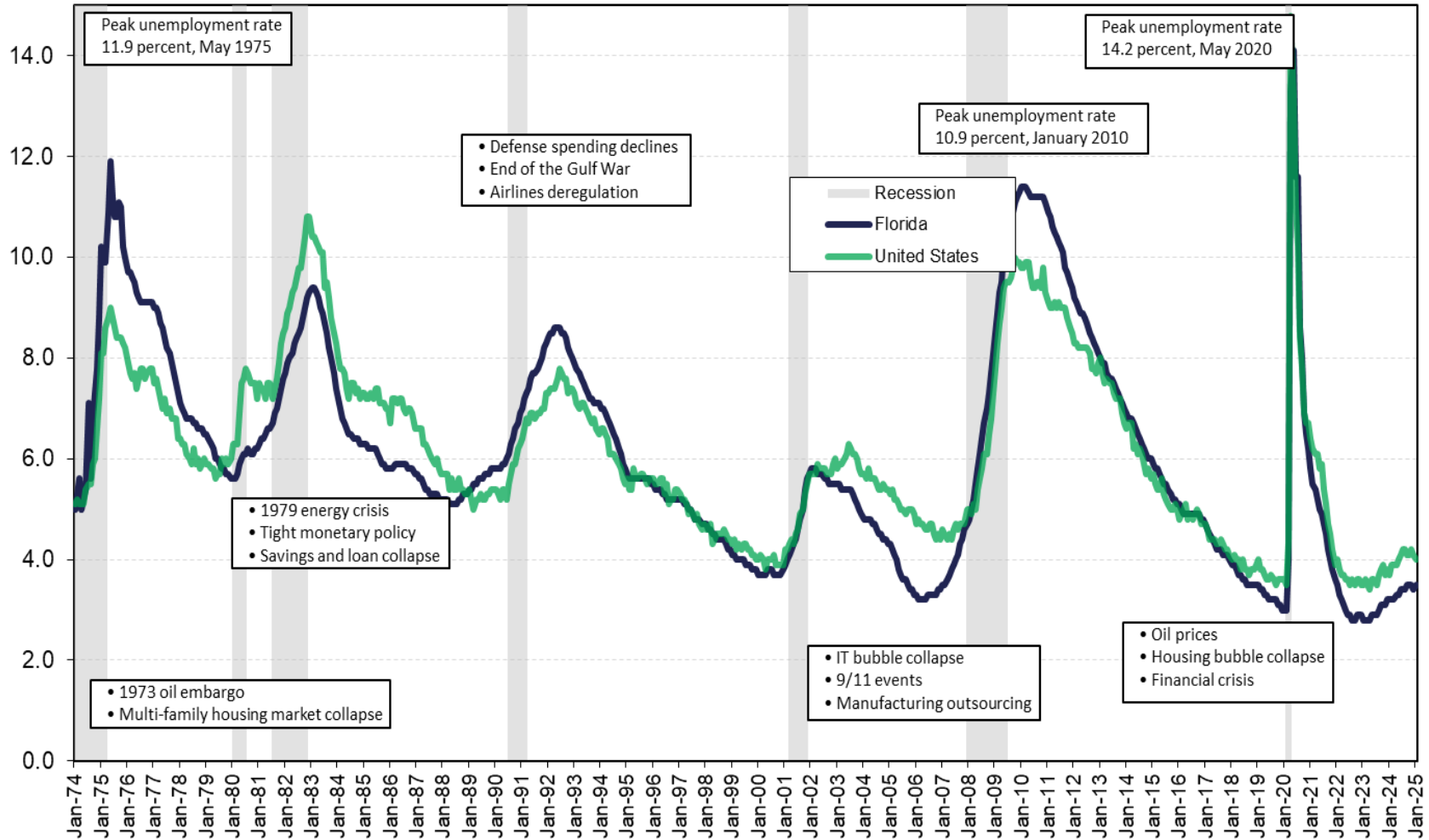

**January 1974 - January 2025**



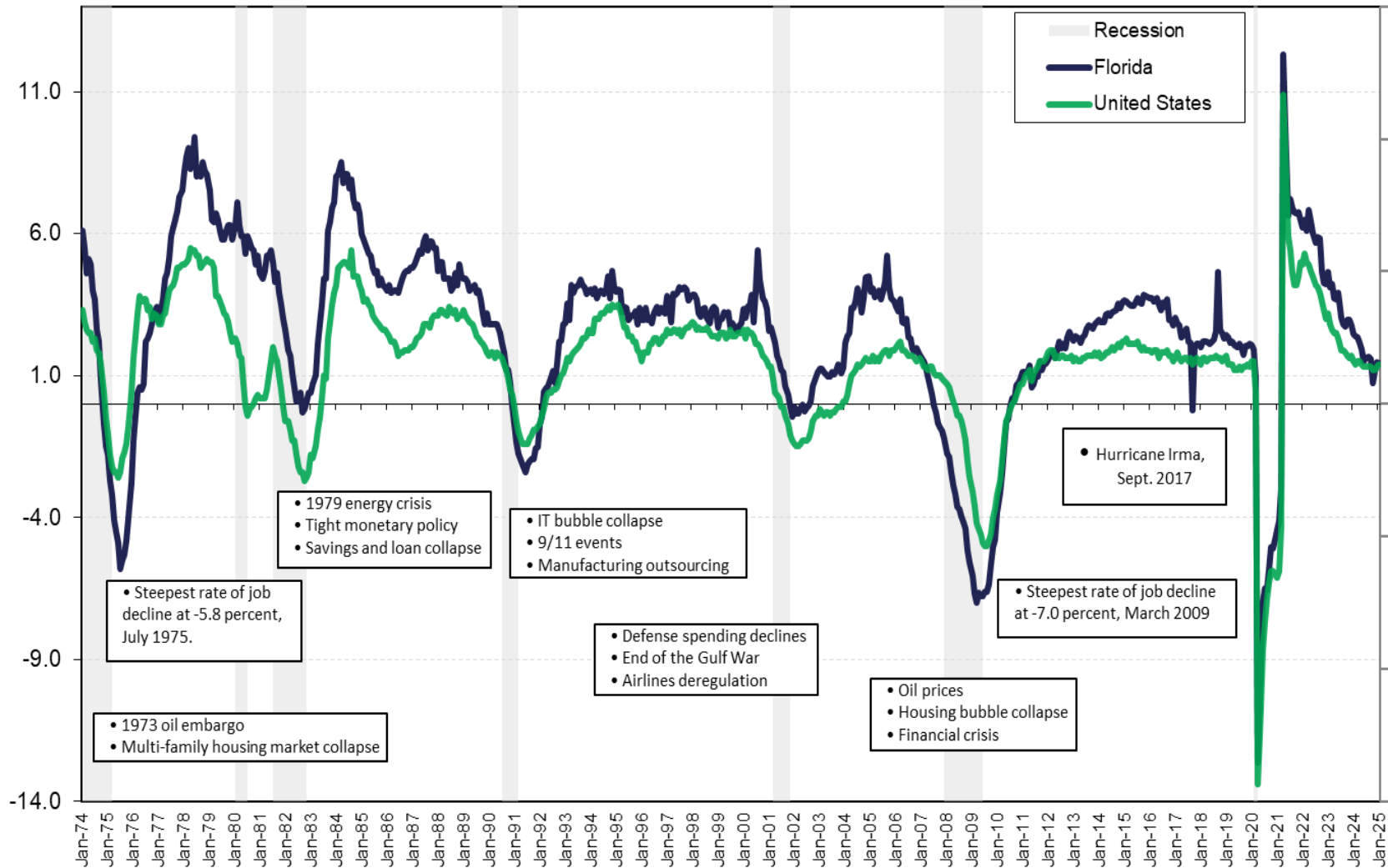

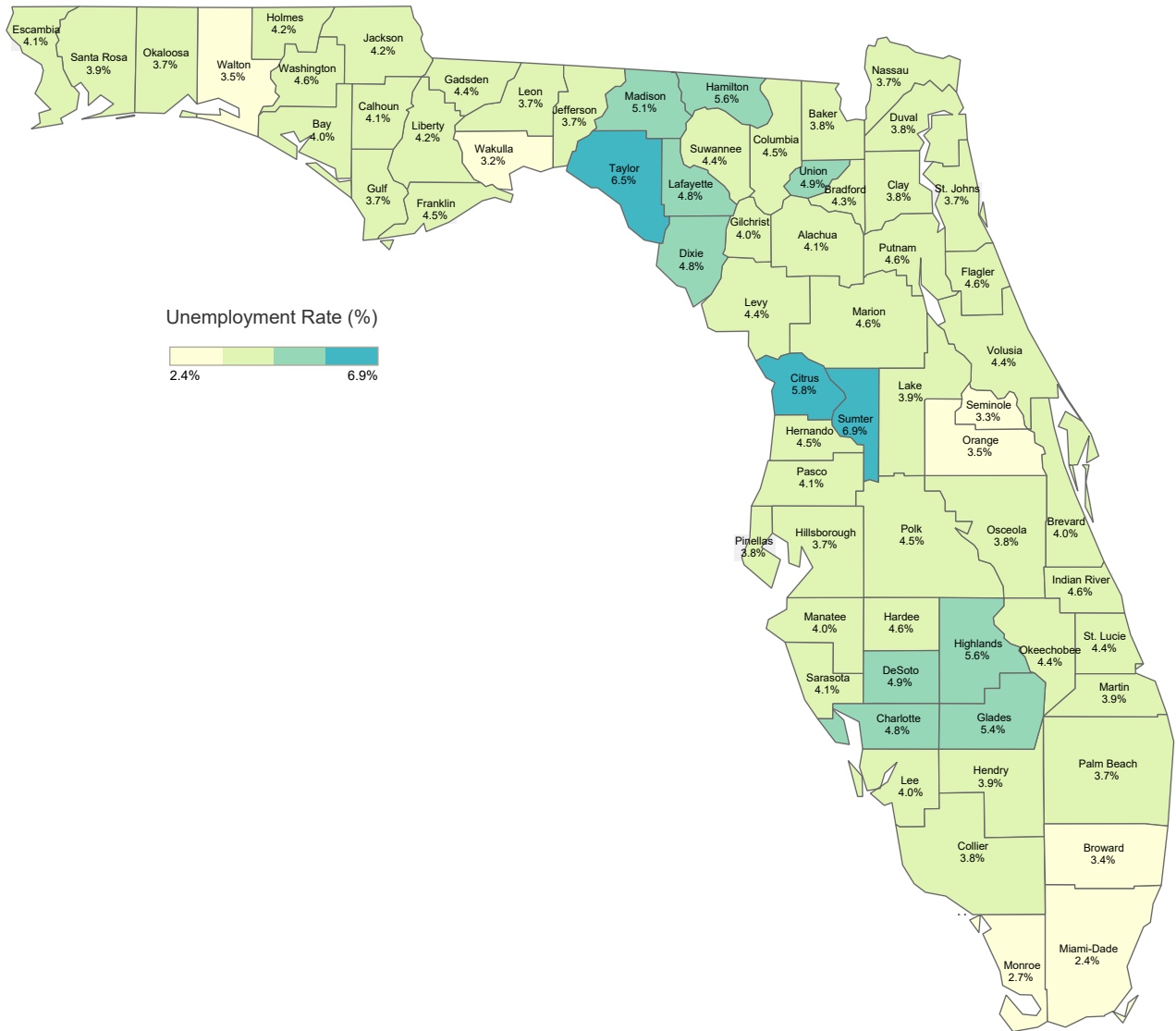
# Florida and the United States Total Nonagricultural Employment Annual Growth Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - January 2025
