

Florida's February Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in February 2025, up 0.1 percentage point from the January 2025 rate, and up 0.4 percentage point from a year ago. There were 398,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,196,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in February.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,024,100 in February 2025, an increase of 7,400 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 128,300 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.3 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.2 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in February.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+39,700 jobs, +2.6 percent); total government (+22,600 jobs, +2.0 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+20,600 jobs, +1.0 percent); construction (+16,900 jobs, +2.6 percent); other services (+8,700 jobs, +2.3 percent); financial activities (+6,200 jobs, +0.9 percent); leisure and hospitality (+4,300 jobs, +0.3 percent); manufacturing (+4,000 jobs, +0.9 percent); professional and business services (+3,500 jobs, +0.2 percent); and information (+1,900 jobs, +1.2 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In February 2025, Miami-Dade County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.6 percent), followed by Monroe County (2.7 percent), and Wakulla County at (3.2 percent).
- Sumter County had the highest unemployment rate (6.8 percent) in Florida in February 2025, followed by Taylor County (6.5 percent), and Citrus County (5.7 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In February 2025, 18 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+30,500 jobs, +2.0 percent), followed by the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+24,200 jobs, +1.8 percent), and the Tampa MD (+14,000 jobs, +1.3 percent).
- Seven metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in February 2025. The areas with the largest losses were the Naples-Marco Island MSA (-1,500 jobs, -0.8 percent), the St. Petersburg-Clearwater-Largo MD (-1,300 jobs, -0.3 percent), Cape Coral-Fort Myers MSA (-700 jobs, -0.2 percent), and the Sebastian-Vero Beach MSA (-400 jobs, -0.7 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.





January 1974 - February 2025




Florida and the United States Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - February 2025
