

Florida's May Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.7 percent in May 2025, unchanged from the April 2025 rate, and up 0.4 percentage point from a year ago. There were 414,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 11,200,000. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.2 percent in May.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 10,086,700 in May 2025, an increase of 20,500 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 148,700 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.5 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.1 percent over the year.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- All ten major industries experienced positive over-the-year job growth in May.
- The industries gaining jobs over the year included education and health services (+49,500 jobs, +3.2 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+32,100 jobs, +1.6 percent); professional and business services (+16,300 jobs, +1.0 percent); total government (+14,200 jobs, +1.2 percent); other services (+10,200 jobs, +2.7 percent); construction (+9,900 jobs, +1.5 percent); financial activities (+5,600 jobs, +0.8 percent); manufacturing (+4,200 jobs, +1.0 percent); leisure and hospitality (+4,100 jobs, +0.3 percent); and information (+2,600 jobs, +1.7 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2025, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.4 percent), followed by Miami-Dade County (2.7 percent), and Wakulla County (3.0 percent).
- Taylor County had the highest unemployment rate (6.2 percent) in Florida in May 2025, followed by Sumter County (6.0 percent), and Citrus County (5.2 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In May 2025, 21 of all 25 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford MSA (+31,900 jobs, +2.1 percent), followed by the Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall MD (+23,700 jobs, +1.8 percent), and the Tampa MD (+16,000 jobs, +1.5 percent).
- Four metro areas in Florida lost jobs over the year in May 2025. The areas losing jobs were the Naples- Marco Island MSA (-2,000 jobs, -1.1 percent), followed by the St. Petersburg-Clearwater-Largo MD (-700 jobs, -0.1 percent), the Crestview-Fort Walton Beach-Destin MSA (-400 jobs, -0.3 percent), and the Panama City-Panama City Beach MSA (-100 jobs, -0.1 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Commerce.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.







Florida Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods, Seasonally Adjusted January 1974 - May 2025




Florida and the United States Unemployment Rates and Recessionary Periods January 1974 - May 2025




